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## European Academy of Management

European researchers have a need for a common academic platform for active networking as well as for the development of European research traditions. This includes an increased research co-operation across national boundaries, an open and well functioning labour market for academicians within the management field in Europe, and the development of Ph.D. training programmes across institutional and national boundaries.

There is also a growing interest in developing concepts and methods that fit the rapidly changing European business and management context. This includes for example European multiculturalism and political pluralism, the historical and philosophical roots of European research traditions and the transformation of the European e-economy due to technological and institutional changes.

The European Academy of Management wants to be a European forum for networking and research in general management, strategy, corporate governance, organisational theory, organisational behaviour and decision-making.

## Call for Contributions to the founding conference of the European Academy of Management (EURAM):

European Management Research:  
Trends and Challenges. IESE, Barcelona April 21-22, 2001

We are now inviting management scholars across Europe to participate in a founding conference to discuss the creation of a common platform for management research in Europe. The working title of our network is The European Academy of Management (EURAM), and the task of this first meeting is twofold:

1. To identify core research issues and needs in the field of European management research, in order to outline a possible agenda for research in the management field.
2. To found an active European network – an association – of scholars in the management field to work on the issues and needs identified.

The invitation to participate in the founding conference is open to all academicians as well as practitioners interested in promoting research in management in a broad sense. This means that we welcome contributions from various scientific disciplines (economics, sociology, anthropology etc), as well as from various aspects of management (strategy, governance, communication etc), and from different sectors of society (private, public and non-for-profit).

As this is a founding conference, participants are expected to take an active part in discussions and debates. Even though we prefer paper contributions from the participants, we also encourage shorter research notes and conceptual contributions that are in line with the overall theme of the founding conference.
