WHAT IS EECC?

Each year, EURAM supports early-career scholars in management and related fields through a truly special event. The EURAM Early Career Community (EECC) is a consortium of young scholars and the event itself is referred to as the colloquium. Junior scholars from different countries have successfully collaborated with their institutions and EURAM to attract their peers to focus on their own interests and issues. The EECC forms a community within the wider community of engaged management scholars at EURAM, who enjoy unique networking opportunities and targeted events during the Annual Conference.

The aim of the EECC is to provide a platform for early career academics (broadly defined, e.g., assistant professors, post-doctoral researchers, recently appointed lecturers/associate professors, and advanced PhD students) to come together to discuss key challenges, learn from experts, and share career-related insights. The EECC serves as a forum for networking, knowledge exchange, and development of research collaborations.

We attend the EECC with the understanding that there is no single approach to an academic career, each of us must find our own path. At the same time, we recognize that we walk this path best with a strong, supportive network. This year, we aim to maximize these supportive connections through dynamic activities related to addressing the many needs of an early-career researcher. While previous editions have included the colloquium and a follow-up event at the main EURAM conference, this year EECC includes ongoing mentorship to provide even more support.

Objectives

The primary objective of the colloquium is to provide a platform for early career management scholars. This year, our focus will be on charting a course for a successful research career. During the event there will be opportunities for

- Discussing and developing your research ideas
- Seeking expert advice on career development
- Developing a dynamic and successful research trajectory
- Building international connections and exploring possibilities for future collaborations

BOLOGNA

Bologna, the historic capital of the Emilia-Romagna region, is a vibrant and culturally rich city nestled in the heart of Italy. Renowned for its medieval architecture, culinary heritage, and dynamic academic atmosphere, Bologna enchants visitors with its lively piazzas, iconic porticoes, and centuries-old charm. Known as "La Dotta, La Grassa, La Rossa" (The Learned, The Fat, The Red) for its prestigious university, celebrated cuisine, and terracotta-hued buildings, Bologna offers an authentic Italian experience, blending history and innovation in an unforgettable setting.

Things to See

In Bologna, three iconic sites capture the city's charm and depth. Begin at Piazza Maggiore, the vibrant heart of the city, where historic landmarks like the Basilica di San Petronio and Palazzo d'Accursio frame a lively square filled with local life, cafes, and cultural events. Nearby, the famous Two Towers (Le Due Torri)—Asinelli and Garisenda—stand as symbols of Bologna's medieval past. Climb the Asinelli Tower for breathtaking views of the terracotta rooftops that stretch across the city. For a peaceful escape and a glimpse into Bologna's spiritual side, head to the Sanctuary of the Madonna di San Luca. Located on a hilltop and connected to the city by the world's longest portico of 666 arches, it offers stunning vistas and a serene atmosphere, embodying the historical and scenic beauty of Bologna.

Languages

The official language of Bologna is Italian, but English is commonly spoken, especially in popular tourist areas, restaurants, and hotels. Many locals, particularly those working in hospitality, have a good understanding of English. While most public transport signs are in Italian, you'll generally find English translations or assistance available at major transit hubs and key attractions.

Eating

Bologna, famed for its culinary heritage, offers a rich array of dining experiences to satisfy any taste. Known as the food capital of Italy, it's the birthplace of iconic dishes like tagliatelle "al ragù" and tortellini. Typical eating times in Bologna may be a bit later than some visitors are accustomed to, with lunch usually beginning around 13:00 and dinner typically starting at 19:30 or later. Several restaurants in the city center offer more flexible hours.

Osteria dell'Orsa or Ca'Pelletti are popular choices, known for traditional Bolognese cuisine served in a cozy, welcoming atmosphere. Another excellent option includes Trattoria di Via Serra, where you can enjoy regional specialties in a rustic setting. Dining in Bologna is a memorable experience, with many restaurants emphasizing fresh, local ingredients and time-honored recipes.

How to get from Bologna Airport to the city center?

Traveling from Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport (BLQ) to the city center is straightforward, with several convenient options available:

1. Marconi Express Monorail

The Marconi Express is a dedicated monorail connecting the airport directly to Bologna Centrale railway station.

- Frequency: Every 15 minutes.
- Tickets: €9.20 for a one-way ticket; €17 for a round trip. Tickets can be purchased online, at vending machines in the stations, or via contactless payment methods.

2. Bus Services

TPER, the local transport company, operates bus routes connecting the airport to various parts of the city:

- Route 944: Connects the airport to Bologna Centrale railway station, with intermediate stops.
 - Frequency: Every 20 minutes from 5:00 AM to 12:45 AM.
 - Tickets: €1.50 if purchased in advance; €2 if bought on board

3. Taxi

Taxis are readily available outside the arrivals area:

• Cost: Around €20-25 to the city center

- 3. Hotel University (average 80€ per night)
 - Location: Via Mentana, 7
 - Description: Close to the University of Bologna, this hotel offers a modern and comfortable stay, with easy access to city attractions. Guests often praise the clean rooms and attentive staff.
 - Amenities: Free Wi-Fi, continental breakfast, and proximity to cafes and shops.

- 4. I Portici Hotel Bologna (average 120€ per night)
 - Location: Via Indipendenza, 69
 - Description: A luxurious 4-star hotel in a beautifully restored historic building, featuring elegant rooms and a Michelin-starred restaurant on-site. Its central location and high-end amenities make it a top choice.
 - Amenities: Michelin-starred dining, complimentary Wi-Fi, and terrace with city views.

Public Transport

Bologna offers a variety of public transportation options to help you navigate the city efficiently:

Buses and Trolleybuses: Operated by TPER (Trasporto Passeggeri Emilia-Romagna),
 Bologna's extensive network of buses and trolleybuses connects various

neighborhoods and suburban areas. Tickets can be purchased at vending machines, kiosks, or via the official TPER app
